Promoter Eudore Pilon dies

A civic-minded citizen, Mr. Eudore Pilon 66 died on June 18, 1984. He had been in failing health during past months.

Funeral services were held in Notre-Dame Church, Valleyfield, with burial at the St. Timothée cemetery.

Mr. Pilon had the reputation of being a most alert and modern promoter, specializing in public relations. He directed an important beverage business in Valleyfield and surrounding municipalities for

some twenty years between 1945 and 1965.

Although he was very active, he also found time to act as president of the Junior Chamber of Commerce of Valleyfield. Mr. Pilon was also one of the founders of Camp Bosco where youngsters spend their summer on an island. He was also identified with many local and regional associations.

During his last years, Mr. Pilon was the managing-director of La Cité des Arts et des Sports in Valleyfield.

He was successful in giving it the importance and prestige it needed.

Born in St. Timothée, Mr. Pilon contributed more than his fair share to the development of Valleyfield and its area.

He leaves to mourn his wife (née Lucille Montpetit) formerly of Huntingdon; three sons and one daughter; three brothers and one sister, including Mr. Albert Pilon, of St-Timothée; as well as many relatives and friends.
