Woman drowns in St. Anicet

The body of a 34-year-old woman who drowned in Lake St. Francis on Wednesday, August 22, was recovered on Friday, August 24.

Nicole Lanctôt Brunet from Kirkland, drowned near Grenadine Island, off St. Anicet, after she made a false move at the helm of a sailboat.

The body was found by two young people near Chantigny Island in Valleyfield on Friday.

Police inquiry into the tragic event, started by Officer André Thibodeau of the Huntingdon Detachment of the Sûreté du Québec, was later transferred to the Montreal SQ.
