Former Huntingdon Mills President dies

Enoch Roskies passed away on February 25, 1985 after an illness lasting several months. He was one of the founders and President of Huntingdon Mills Ltd.

Mr. Roskies was born in 1900 in the city of Bialystok, which today belongs to Poland, but at that time belonged to Russia. Mr. Roskies was originally a teacher and later the principal of a high school. Eventually he entered the rubber business, moved to Roumania, where he managed a large rubber footwear manufacturing plant.

In 1939 he came to Canada, founding the Huntingdon Woolen Mills, together with his brothers Owsej, Isaac, Leo, nephew Henry and Messrs A. Weintraub and E. Zeisler. During the war the mill produced fabrics for uniforms and blankets for the Canadian Armed Forces. Mr. Roskies was also interested in Popular Rugs Ltd. and Lindsay Woolen Mills. As well, he was active in various charities in Montreal.



Mr. Roskies is survived and mourned by his widow, Mrs. Mandy Roskies, son Ralph, who is a Professor of Physics at the University of Pittsburg, daughter Doreen, six grandchildren and many other members of his family.

Mr. Enoch Roskies was an extremely erudite and interesting man - an excellent raconteur, with an interest in many subjects. He was widely admired as a kind and wise man, and he will be missed by all who knew him.
