Feted on 80th birthday

On April 13 the family of Miss Mary Van Vliet gathered at her home in Lacolle to celebrate her 80th birthday.

Present were 43 nieces and nephews with their children as well as her sister Alice Buchanan of Lachine, her brothers Thomas and David of Lacolle and Jonathan of Montreal.

Prevented from attending, due to distance and the infirmities of age, were her 93-year-old sister Florence Hewson of Toronto and her 90-year-old brother Lyman of Montreal.

Miss Van Vliet is the eleventh of 13 children born to Lachlan Van Vliet of Lacolle and Agnes Watt of Dewittville and she keeps in very close touch with her six remaining sisters and brothers.

She attended Lacolle Elementary School and then Huntingdon Academy and graduated from Macdonald College School for Teachers in 1925. She taught for one year as Principal of Beauharnois

Elementary School before spending 33 years at Tetreaultville School in the east end of Montreal, with 15 of these years as Principal, and ending her career as Principal of Millar School in St. Laurent.

On her birthday, one of her Tetreaultville teachers sent her a beautiful bouquet of carnations and a former pupil from there, whose mother, father,

aunts, uncles and brother were all pupils of Miss Van Vliet, phoned her on behalf of the family. These expressions of kind remembrance meant a great deal to her and speaks well for the love and esteem in which she was held.

In 1964 she retired to her home in Lacolle and since has led a very active life with special interest in the church, the choir and the U.C.W. She has acted both as President and Secretary of the latter and is at present Secretary of the Lacolle United Church Committee of Stewards and also of the Lacolle-Clarenceville Pastoral Charge.

After her retirement Miss Van Vliet took up oil painting and at this party she was presented with a beautiful book entitled, "The Heritage of Canadian Art, The McMichael Collection," with a loving and appreciative inscription from her family.
