I'm sorry to say that this New Year has begun with a number of sad losses affecting the Valleyfield English community.

The community extends deepest sympathy to the family of Jean Paul Beauchamp, who died very suddenly on Sunday, Jan. 17, aged 67 years.

It will be remembered that for many years Jean-Paul was an excellent photographer, with his own photographic studio located on Grande Ile, until his retirement three or four years ago.

A funeral service was held at Notre Dame de Belleve Church, at 11 a.m., on Saturday, Jan. 23, with many friends and acquaintances joining family members in their final farewells.

Left to mourn his loss are his wife, Mary (née Savich), three brothers: Gilles, Gerald and Jean Marc, and four sisters: Laurette (Leduc), Yolande (Rochefort), Thérèse (Loiselle), and Jeannine (Dicaire) all of whom reside in the Valleyfield area. He was predeceased by one sister, Carmen, a few years ago.

Jean-Paul will also be sadly missed by his brothers-in-law: Danny Savich, of Hamilton, Ont., Mike Savich of Ormstown, Nick and Peter Savich of Valleyfield and all their families.

Deepest sympathy is also extended to the family of Reggie Hawkhurst, who passed away at Le Centre Hospitalier de Valleyfield, on Jan. 7, after a lengthy illness. He was 59 years of age.
