John Stewart, 77 mourned in V'field

The Valleyfield community was saddened to learn of the unexpected death of John Herbert Stewart, aged 77, on Wednesday, Feb. 23 at Le Centre Hospitalier de Valleyfield.

Herbie, who was the eldest son of John and Florence Stewart, was born in Howick in 1916.

While he was still very young the family moved to Beauhamois wherethey lived for a short time, and where Herbie commenced his schooling.

The family then moved permanently to Valleyfield, where he attended the Gault Institute with his siblings.

After finishing school, Herbie became an employee of the old Montreal Cottons of Valleyfield.

At the onset of World War II, he joined the Canadian Army and was assigned to the Royal Canadian Engineer Corps.

He saw service in England and Europe, and near the end of the war he was wounded in action in Germany, from where he was shipped to a hospital in England for recuperation.

After demobilization he returned to his job at the Montreal Cottons (now Dominion Textiles), where he remained until his early retirement due to a health problem.

In 1953 he married Pearl Calvert, younger daughter of Herbert and Margaret Calvert, also of Valleyfield. They became the proud parents of three children, Debbie, John and Iim.

Herbie had been an active member of Branch 62, Royal Canadian Legion since its inception and had held office as president for a number of years. He was also an active member of the Valleyfield Curling Club.

The funeral service was held at 2 p.m. Monday, Feb. 28 at the Valleyfield Presbyterian/United Church. Student minister Bryon Grace officiated with a moving service

Members of Valleyfield Legion Branch 62 attended and presented flags. Members of the Valleyfield Curling Club joined family members and many other friends. Alegion Member and old family friend, Clifford Winter, read the Lesson.

The little church was filled to capacity with friends who came to say farewell to this very friendly pleasant person.

Following the service, Herbie was laid to rest along with old Comrades, in the Branch 62 Field of Honor located in the Valleyfield Catholic Cemetery.
