It was with great sadness that we learned of the sudden death of war bride Joyce Kathleen Hibbert in Kingston, Ont., on Wednesday, May 3, at the age of 72. She suffered a very brief but courageous battle with cancer.

Joyce was born in Heathfield, Sussex, England, on November 19, 1923.

In March, 1945, she married Eric Hibbert, in Heathfield. (Eric, who was born in Valleyfield, is the brother of the late Elsi Morin (née Hibbert) of Valleyfield.)

Joyce arrived in Canada as a war bride in 1946. The couple settled in Kingston, and became the proud parents of three children, Rodney, Lorne and Diana. In March of this year they celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary.

Joyce will be remembered by many local war brides for her two books: "The War Brides," and "Fragments of War". She was working on a

third book at the time of her death, which she had not quite finished.

The funeral service was held at the James Reid Catharqui Chapel, in Kingston, on Saturday, May 6.

Many family members and friends, some from Valleyfield, Drummondville, Toronto and Ste. Catherine's, Ont., attended the funeral service.

In accordance with her last wishes, her ashes will be taken to her hometown in England for interment.
