Mrs. Edith MacDougall dies in Regina

Edith Marian Gaye MacDougall passed away January 5 at Pioneer Nursing Home at Regina, Sk.

She was born November 3, 1896 in Nepal, India where her father was bandmaster for the British Army. At the age of five, she was sent to her grandmother's home in England for her schooling. By then she was fluent in the local Indian dialect and phrases of it, remained in her mind throughout her life.

Moved to Canada

She trained in music and social work, and in 1920, she and her widowed mother emigrat-

ed to Canada, where they settled in Regina.

There she met and married Alexander MacDougall from the Ormstown area. He grew up on the family farm at Tatehurst and at an early age went west where he became a skilled carpenter. With his Ormstown neighbor, Wallace McMullan, also a top tradesman, they built several elegant houses in the relatively new town of Regina.

In 1931 Edith and Alex moved north to Wood, Sk. where as they took up and carved

out a farm. Their home became a refuge for visiting ministers of different denominations.

When Alex passed away in 1961, Edith returned to Regina where she performed volunteer work for several organizations. She was a talented and capable person, with an alert mind to the end.

A funeral service was held January 10 in Regina. Relatives from Peachland B.C., Albernethy, Sk., Regina and Ormstown also attended.
