Jeanne was a graduate of Montreal School of Music and a concert pianist in Montreal for many years. She gave piano lessons to many children in our Franklin area during the

She was predeceased by two sisters, Aline, Flore, and one brother Arthur.

A member of Franklin W.I. and a faithful church attendant, her kind words and thoughtful consideration touched all who knew her.

Mayor Marion Trépanier dies suddenly

The community was in shock on New Year's Day as it learned of the sudden passing of Godmanchester mayor Marion Trépanier at a New Year's Eve party December 31st in Ste-Barbe.

He died of a cardiac arrest.

Marion Trépanier was mayor of the Municipality of the Township of Godmanchester since 1979, at which time he won the hotly debated mayoralty race against his opponent Roger Goyer. On being proclaimed winner on election night, Mr. Trépanier had suffered a first heart attack and had been forced to take a few months' rest. He had been re-elected mayor by acclamation for another four years in last November's election and had promised to continue working for the good of his fellow citizens and his municipality.

Mr. Trépanier had started his municipal political career as councillor on the God-

manchester council. He served under mayors Charles Reid and René Racine. In 1979, when René Racine decided to leave the municipal scene, Trépanier decided to seek the mayor's chair.

Under his administration, the tax rate in Godmanchester remained at 40¢ per \$100 during three years, which seemed to prove a sound management of municipal affairs.

Marion Trépanier was one of the founding members of the Municipalité Régionale de comté du Haut-Saint-Laurent. From the start he was able to strongly voice his ideas about this new structure and he gained the respect of the fourteen other mayors on the MRC board.

Huntingdon mayor Gerald Brisebois, at the Town council meeting last Monday night, January 9, made himself the spokesman for the whole council when he offered his condolences to the family

of Marion Trépanier. "It was an honor for me to sit on the MRC board with him," said Brisebois adding that "Marion Trépanier was truly a sincere and honest man."

The last official duty performed by Marion Trépanier was December 23 when he signed the bus contract with the Transbus Inc. company in the presence of Huntingdon mayor and chairman of the transportation committee, Gerald Brisebois and of the MRC secretary, Jacques Pateau, and the owner of the bus company Léo Laplante.

For everyone, the sudden passing of Marion Trépanier is seen as premature as he was only 47. He was known as an untiring worker who enjoyed life tremendously.

Marion Trépanier is survived by his wife Marie-Berthe Leboeuf, his son Marion, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edmour Trépanier, brother Gilles and a sister Mignonne.
