Born in Rockburn, Que., April 11, 1924, to the late Mr. and Mrs. Jos Sloan and educated in Ormstown. Que.

He joined the R.C.A.F. in 1942. He was to become one of Canada's most outstanding pilots, winning many honours and awards. He served in many command posts during his twenty-five years of twenty-five years of military service, retiring in 1968 at Lt. Cmdr.
