Local contractor will long be remembered

Mr. Earl Fournier, who passed away on February 22, 1984, was born in St-Anicet, Que. on February 2, 1910. He was a resident of Huntingdon for over 50 years.

He was a farmer from 1931 to 1934 after which he worked as a gas tax inspector for the government in 1936-37.

After a long illness in 1937-38, Mr. Fournier went into poultry farming for three years. He then worked as a carpenter with Bill Harvey for a few years. With the latter, he took part in the construction of the Braithwaite store and of the military barracks during the 1939-45 war.

His first contract as a general building contractor was the renovation of the sacristy in St. Joseph's Church.

Here are some of his most important constructions, without counting the many family dwellings he built: renovation of the Hotel Ste-Barbe, gymnasium and renovation of St-Anicet elementary school, the

first part of the Nurses' Residence in Ormstown, completion of the Huntingdon Arena, renovation of the Montpetit Funeral Home, many additions to the Cleyn & Tinker plants, hydraulic press at Cleyn & Tinker, the first Caisse Populaire building, Huntingdon Hospital (rear part), the Rod & Gun Motel.

Mr. Fournier bought the Lake street lumberyard in February 1960, where he operated a business until 1976.

Mr. Fournier gave work to many people and brought together the largest group of carpenters in Huntingdon. He had up to 44 employees at one time.

Mr. Fournier was active in municipal politics as alderman for many years.

He was a political organizer for the Union Nationale party during the time of Maurice Duplessis, working for the election of Mr. Fisher as well as Alister Somerville.

Later in his life, Mr. Fournier became interested in harness horse

racing. He started in 1965 with a first mare "Margo Will". He trained about 25 horses.

His greatest success in this field was no doubt having made "Prince Colonial" the 2-year-old champion ambleur of the Province of Quebec in 1981. His favorite horse, before being injured in 1982, ran a mile in 1:58.4 something rarely achieved. Both the Huntingdon Rotary and Optimist Clubs honored Mr. Fournier for this success.

Mr. Fournier leaves to mourn: his wife Yvonne Gauthier and his 10 children: Lucienne (Maurice Perreault), Rhéjane, Maurice (Anita Galipeau), Réal (Béatrice Galipeau), Pierrette (Jean-Guy Lévesque) of Montreal, Nicole (Clermont Laurendeau), André (Ann Kelly), Monique (Réal Chabot) of St-Hubert, Guy (Marjolaine Montpetit), Marie-Paule (Alain D'Aoust) of St-Antoine des Laurentides. Also 24 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

He was still very active with many plans for the future when death came suddenly.
