Former hockey star dies in Valleyfield

A former star player with Valleyfield Braves of the Quebec Senior Hockey League, Marcel Bessette died last week, after a lengthy illness. He was in his 66th year.

Born in Montreal, Marcel had made a name for himself with the Braves where he was known and recognized as a beautiful stickhandler and a rugged player. He was as much at ease on right wing or at centre. Marcel was

directly implicated in a transaction which caused quite a furore at the time. Along with his brother Roger who was also playing in Valleyfield in the nets, they were sent to Sherbrooke in exchange for Paul Leclerc. That decision took place in the summer of 1950. It is recalled that Arthur Vinet and Toe Blake made the decision for Valleyfield while Yvan Dugré was the spokesman for the St. Francis of Sherbrooke hockey team.

Marcel retired a few months ago after working for Schenley and Hydro-Quebec. He leaves his wife, Jacqueline, three children, Louis, Francine and Normand, his mother, Mrs. R. Bessette, as well as his brother Roger who was a netminder for Cleveland of the American Hockey League, Valleyfield and Sherbrooke.

Funeral services were held last Friday at St. Esprit Church, Valleyfield.
