Huntingdon teenager hit and killed along Route 138

A 19 year old girl was killed last Saturday morning at 2:30 a.m. when she was hit by a truck in Godmanchester.

The victim is Sylvie Royal, the daughter of Robert and Rachel Royal of 2 Somerville Street in Huntingdon.

The tragic accident occurred on Route 138 in Godmanchester where Sylvie was walking.

She was hit by a 1984 Toyota Pick Up truck driven by Terrence Murphy of Huntingdon.

The victim was taken to the Centre Hospitalier de Huntingdon where she was pronounced dead by Dr. Jean-Pierre Hebert.

Officer Leon Gillesson of the Huntingdon QPP is conducting a police investigation into the accident. He will submit his

report for study to the Huntingdon coroner, Dr. Georges Lefebvre.

The nature and causes of the fatal accident have not yet been determined.

Relatives and friends paid their respects at the Montpetit Funeral Home and the funeral service was held on Monday, June 18 at the St. Joseph Parish Church in Huntingdon.
