Former Gleaner editor dies in Nova Scotia

Kenneth G. Wright, a retired newspaper man, died on Sunday, Sept. 16, 1984 at Yarmouth, N.S. in his 76th year.

Ken was well-known in the Huntingdon area, as he lived in Elgin Township for over 10 years. He also worked as Gleaner editor from January 1972 to October 1973. In later years, he was often called to replace other editors on vacation. The Wright family moved to Nova

Scotia around 1980.

Ken Wright was not one to talk about his past ac-complishments, but many who came in contact with him during his stay in the Huntingdon area were aware of his stature as a newspaperman and a writer. He contributed to articles many magazines in Canada and the U.S. His feelings on some matters were strong that he sent letters to the editor of newspapers all over, even as far as Calgary. He would sometimes sign his letters with pen names.

Ken Wright is survived by his wife, the former Margaret Commander, his son, Peter, and three children from his previous marriage, Kenneth Jr., Paul and Carol.

A private funeral was held in Yarmouth, with burial in the Field of Honor in Montreal.
