Barrington helped build Ormstown

Ivan David Barrington was born in Ormstown on February 8, 1913 - the eldest son of seven children to Mr. David Archibald Barrington and his wife Celia Florence McWhinnie.

Educated in Ormstown, and later at Feller Institute, Mr. Barrington became a carpenter by trade. Married to Winetta Myrrn Greig on July 28, 1933, they had eight children: Jack, Joan, Rodney, Berniece, Sandra, James, Errollyn and Murray Leclair. His sons-in-law and daughters-in-law

as well as twenty grandchildren and two great-grandchildren mourn his passing. Mr. Barrington is also survived by two brothers and one sister Messrs. Mervin and Alton and Mrs. Ross Winter.

Along with his late father, Mr. Barrington built many buildings in the Chateauguay Valley and operated a large lumber yard. He served several years on the Ormstown Village Council and was a past president of the Ormstown Curling Club. For several years before his retirement, Mr. Barrington

was associated with the Farmers Mutual Insurance in this area.

For Fifty years he served diligently on the Ormstown Fire Department and was fire chief for several of those years. He was so very proud of his association with the many firemen in the area as well as Mutual Aid, also his roll in the realization of the new Fire Station in Ormstown.

The funeral service was held at the Ormstown Presbyterian Church, service conducted by the Rev. G. Bannerman and Pere Beaulieu on Wednesday, April 17, 1985. Two of his favorite hymns were sung by the choir Safe in The Arms of Jesus and What a Friend we Have In Jesus. Mr. Howard Welburn sang The Old Rugged Cross, and his granddaughter Wanda Rankin read the 23rd Psalm.

Pallbearers were his grandsons, Messrs John and Robert Barrington, Greig Barrington, Lachlan and Jamie Rankin and Paul Dumas. Interment at the Ormstown Union Cemetery.
