## Fatal motorcycle accident

A young man from Huntingdon, Pierre Joly, was killed in a traffic accident involving three vehicles on May 8 at 7:40 a.m.

The tragedy occurred in front of No. 230, route 132 in Sainte-Barbe.

At the time of the accident, Pierre Joly was travelling east on a 1984 Honda motorcycle, on his way to work at Hydro-Quebec in Valleyfield.

The two other vehicles involved were a 1977 Pontiac, driven by Michel L'Heureux of Huntingdon and a 1977 Dodge driven by Claude Bérubé of Saint-Hubert.

Both L'Heureux and Joly were driving east towards Valleyfield while Bérubé

was going towards Huntingdon.

Officers Coursy and Thibaudeau of the Huntingdon QPP went to the scene of the accident.

The victim was taken by ambulance to the Huntingdon County Hospital where the doctor on duty pronounced him dead.

The police investigation into the accident is continuing and a complete report will be given to the district coroner soon.

Bérubé's car and Joly's motorcycle were damaged for over \$500 while the car driven by L'Heureux had damages of about \$250.

The funeral for Pierre Joly, 27, husband of Joanne O'Connor, was held in St. Joseph's Church on Friday, May 10, 1985.
