

Genevieve Louisa Getty dies after battle with cancer

Genevieve Louisa Getty died on April 28, 1985 at her home in Bath Ontario after a lengthy battle with cancer.

Daughter of William Getty and his wife Annie Brewer, Genevieve Getty was born September 5, 1905 at Island Brook, Quebec. She graduated from the Coaticook High School and attended MacDonald College for her teacher training. Early in her experience, she taught in Waterville and Ormstown schools but the major part of her teaching career was spent at the Galt Institute, Valleyfield. Here she taught senior grades and served as vice principal.

She was dedicated to excellence in her profession and will be remembered by many

former students as a master in her field. She served as president of the Provincial Association of Protestant Teachers and was a life member of that organization at the time of her death. She was also a member of the Canadian College of Teachers.

Always active in the Valleyfield community, her service was recognized when she was cited by the city of Valleyfield as an outstanding citizen at Expo '87.

Over a number of years, her summer holidays had been spent along with her mother at a cottage on Lake Ontario at Milhaven Inn. After her retirement, this became her permanent home in 1975. Here she attended the Edith Rankin

United Church and participated in the Forty Niners Club there. She was active in the Senior Citizens Council of Kingston and the English Speaking Union. She was largely confined to her home for the last four years of her life.

Rev. Ian MacKay presided at the funeral service at the Thompson Jones funeral parlors in Odessa. After cremation, the ashes were interred at the Union Cemetery, Ernestown.

She will be sadly missed by numerous cousins including Ralph Getty of Sherbrooke, Quebec, Mrs. Muriel Brand, Lennoxville, Mrs. Sandra de Sousa, Demorstown, Ontario, as well as a wide circle of friends.

Morgan dies in Montreal

Relatives, friends and neighbours were saddened by the death of Charles Morgan Sr., at the Montreal General Hospital on June 19, 1985.

Charles was born in Rhynie, Scotland on November 27, 1896 was the son of the late James T. Morgan and Elizabeth Hay of New Pitsligo, Scotland. He was pre-deceased by his wife Dorothy Alexina Mitchell. He was the dear father of Gladys Naylor of Toronto, Jean Morgan-Wood of Roxboro, Charles of Hemmingford, James of St. Bernard de Lacolle, Dorothy of Dollard des Ormeaux, ten grandchildren, six great-grandchildren, two brothers and four sisters.

When Mr. Morgan came to Canada, in the early 1920s, as a C.P.R. Policeman he was stationed in New Brunswick where he met Dorothy (his wife) married and later came to Montreal. He worked as door man at the Mount Royal

Hotel for many years and later in the main office at the Royal Bank of Canada.

Mr. Morgan was very humorous and noted for his stories, he will be greatly missed. He loved to hunt (when he had time) in Hemmingford so on his retirement he moved there. He also loved dogs. Upon settling in Hemmingford, he opened a dog kennel on Route 202 where he boarded and trained hunting dogs.

By request of the deceased there was no funeral service but a memorial service was held at Westmount Park United Church on Tuesday June 25. The service was conducted by Rev. Oliver Carmichael of Ormstown United Church a former minister of Mr. Morgan.

His words were very comforting and fitting. Elizabeth Morgan, a daughter-in-law sang a solo "Amazing Grace". Three favorite hymns of Mr. Morgan's "O God, Our Help in Ages Past", "Rock of Ages", and "Nearer My

God To Thee" were sung.

Mr. Mac English of Hemmingford, Vice President of the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 244 of which Mr. Morgan was a Life Member, conducted the Legion Memorial Service. The family expresses a vote of thanks to Mac English, Boyd Campbell, Bruce Ellerton, Arnel Emond and Nancy and Cecil Hamilton for attending the Memorial Service.

A granddaughter, Wendy Verrecchia, who is employed with the R.C.M.P. in Regina was in full uniform and told in a few words what her grandfather meant to her.

In closing Mr. William Scannell piper played "Mourners Lament."

The family received friends and guests after the service at his daughter Dorothy's, in Dollard Des Ormeaux.

The ashes will be taken to McAdam, New Brunswick, where he will be laid to rest beside his wife.


