An accident which took place on September 12 in St. Anicet ended tragically as one of the drivers involved died in hospital on Monday, Sept. 16.

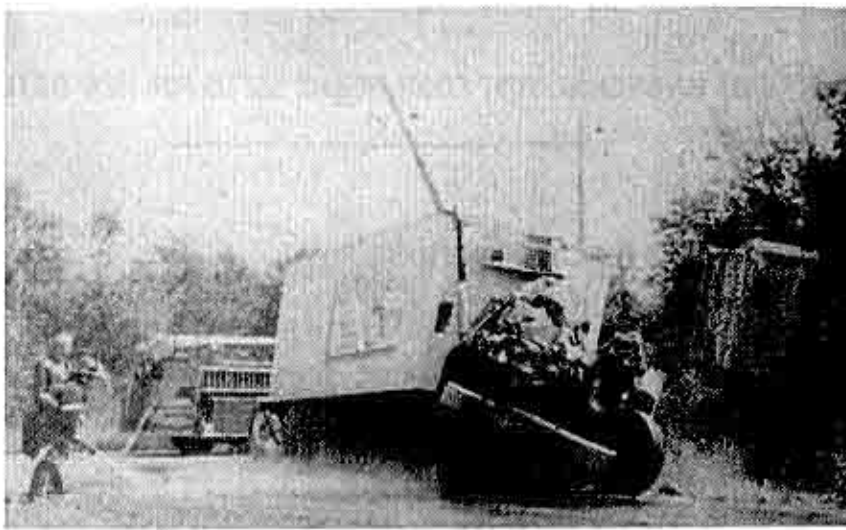
Colin Dubé of Longueuil was seriously injured when the truck he was driving for Desisle Yogurt Company
