Young woman dies, following motorcycle accident

A young woman, Ruth Cogswell, 23 of Howick, died on Wednesday, Sept. 25 at the Royal Victoria Hospital in Montreal, following a motorcycle accident that took place on September 22.

The victim was a passenger on a 1974 Honda motorcycle, driven by David Henry of Nova Scotia. The accident happened opposite no. 2356

Route 201, near the intersection of Rang du Quatre in the Parish of St. Malachie of Ormstown.

The motorcycle collided with a 1978 Dodge, driven by Roland Dagenais of Ormstown.

Ruth Cogswell and David Henry were both taken by ambulance to the Barrie Memorial Hospital Centre in Ormstown, from where they were im-

mediately transferred; one to the Royal Victoria and the other to the Montreal General Hospital.

Officer Normand Dumouchel of the Ste-Martine Detachment of the Sûreté du Québec was called to the scene to investigate the circumstances of this fatal accident.
