Robert M. McCaig dies suddenly at age 74

The community was shocked and saddened on January 2, 1986 to hear of the sudden death of one of its most respected citizens in the person of Robert M. McCaig.

Born July 6, 1911 son of the late Donald McCaig and his wife Jessie Tait, Robert (Bob) spent his entire life at his beloved Morrison's Ford - home of his ancestors.

Despite severe arthritis, Bob was active in many community affairs. As a member of Georgetown Presbyterian Church, he served on various boards - for 35 years he was Trustee of Cemetery Co. Ltd., 24 of

those years as President. In 1953 he was Worshipful Master of Glenorm Masonic Lodge no. 86 and a devoted member of the Lodge.

He was an early enthusiastic supporter of Chateauguay Valley Historical Society.

His other interests were many and varied - gardening - woodworking, at which he was a true craftsman - as a raconteur has was unsurpassed - greatly interested in projects and problems of young farmers, himself a farmer, he applauded their successes - in politics he took an active interest at all levels of government.

By the hospitality in his

home and by his kindly and sympathetic nature, Bob endeared himself to those who knew him, all of whom extend their sympathy to his wife Mary Beatrice (née Kerr) and to his relatives: sister-in-law Mrs Margaret McCaig of Pointe Claire, brother-in-law and sister-in-law Bill and Margaret Wiltshire of Toronto, nephews Dr David G. Wiltshire of Pointe Claire and Robert C. Wiltshire of Toronto.

A private service was held Saturday, January 4 at J.M. Loiselle Funeral Parlors, Ste Martine, conducted by Rev. Malcolm Cogswell who paid tribute to Bob's good relations with everyone. Cremation followed, Interment in Georgetown Cemetery, Howick.
