Evelyn Higgins, 61, dies after prolonged illness

Evelyn Higgins, a highly esteemed and respected resident of St. Anicet and formerly of Huntingdon peacefully passed away in Barrie Memorial Hospital on December 31, 1985, aged 61 years, after a prolonged illness.

Evelyn was the daughter of the late Edward Bannon and Winnifred Massam of Lee's Corner, where she spent her earlier years and attended Huntingdon Convent under the guidance of the Sisters of the Congregation de Notre Dame.

After graduating, Evelyn took up a position with Canadian Vickers Ltd. of Montreal, where she worked until her marriage to James Higgins on June 1, 1946 in St. Joseph's Church, Huntingdon.

She was a zealous member of the Catholic Women's League and an active participant in the Arts & Crafts Recreation Centre of Huntingdon

where she produced many beautiful and useful articles.

Her active part taken in the CVESPA organization along side her husband won them both the honor of being presented with a beautiful plaque for their outstanding efforts in acquiring members for that organization.

Her cheerful attitude and patient endurance of severe pain filled those around her with courage and her inspiring example of a perfect wife, mother and homemaker left many in admiration of her tenacity to overcome her illness.

She will be sorely missed by all who knew her, but especially by her husband Jim, four children, Sharon of Chateaugay, Que. Robert of Montreal, and daughters Gail and Linda also of Montreal and four grandchildren.

She is also mourned by three sisters, Margaret Curran of Nitro, Madeleine McDonagh of Huntingdon, Kathleen McNicol of Cornwall, and brother William of Huntingdon, two sisters-in-law, Ola Beauchesne of Huntingdon and Bertha Germain of Hemmingford, three brothers-in-law Thomas Higgins of St. Anicet and Harold McNicol of Cornwall, Lucien Germain of Hemmingford.

The requiem Mass in St. Anicet, celebrated by Father Georges Quenneville, was largely attended despite severe cold and stormy weather.
