The late Arthur Alexander Kyle

Art Kyle passed away at his home early Thursday morning, January 9, 1986 in his 95th year. He was one of the oldest original residents of Barrington, original Quebec.

Born August 3, 1891, he was the fifth child of the late Joseph and the late Maria Kyle, Although he had been active, chronic bronchitis confined him to his home of late. His mind remained very clear to the last and he was a great source of information. He will be greatly missed by all his relatives and friends.

Predeceased by eight brothers and two sisters, Tom, Fred, Clara, Bill, Tom, Fred, Clara, Bill, Bob, Annie, Hillis, George, Walter and Harry, he leaves to mourn his death one brother, Joe (Roy) of Dorintosh, Sask. three sisters-in-law, many nieces, nephews.

Art left home in 1910 to homestead in Shackleton,

Sask, until he enlisted in the First Depot Battalion, Sask. Regiment, Canadian Expeditionary Force at Regina on May 1, 1918. He was discharged on Jan. 14, 1919 by reason of demobilization, after serving only in Canada.

At his father's request he returned to Barrington to help run the home farm.
Although he had no
children of his own, he
shared the duties of raising two families in the ancestral stone house on Quest Road, first with Walter and Hazel and later with nephew Douglas and Heather.

Art enjoyed taking part in community events, at-tending dances in the Hallerton Hall, and all the other old time customs, such as house parties, harvest crews and more recently during the "Seventies", the Hemmingford Apple Festival, having joined his friends

and relatives in the parade several years and earning a trophy or two for his presentations.

With the advent of television "Hockey Night in Canada" highlighted his Saturday evenings. He was an avid gardener until a few years ago when falling health forced him to give it

His interest in world affairs never faded nor did his interest in family farm affairs. Keeping tab on the day to day activities at the breakfast table, he offered advice and information as needed.

At Hemmingford, Quebec on Saturday, Jan. 11, the Rev. Oliver Carmichael conducted the funeral service and delivered the eulogy paying tribute to Art, who for almost 95 years led a quiet and unpretentious life.

The pallbearers were a grandniece and grand-nephews, Carolyn, Tom, Jim and Rob Kyle.
