The death of Hugh Cavanagh, age 83 of Churubusco, N.Y. occurred on Friday, Jan. 24, 1986.

Born on July 21, 1902 at Ormstown, Que. he was the son of Peter and Kathleen (McKeegan) Cavanagh. He is survived by his two brothers, John Cavanagh of Ormstown, and Andrew Cavanagh of Malone, N.Y., several nieces and nephews and his step-children. He was predeceased by his first wife

Florence Store in 1964, and also his second wife Elizabeth O'Connor Robidoux in 1979.
