Two Hinchinbrooke residents die in traffic mishap

Two Hinchinbrooke residents, Edward Groombridge, 60, and his wife, Leona Cooper (age undetermined by police), died in an accident which occurred around 4 p.m. on Thursday, March 27.

Six other people were injured in the same accident which took place at the exit of the Larocque Bridge in Valleyfield on Route 132 near the intersection of Route 201.

The couple who died in the accident resided at 1141 First Concession in the Township of Hinchinbrooke. They were driving a 1981 black Chevrolet.

Two other cars were involved in the accident. Ginette Castagnier-Leblanc of St. Anicet, driving a 1981 Volkswagen, was slightly injured, as were her three children, Mathieu, 9 years old, Amélie, 8, and Virginie 5.

The third vehicle was driven by John Hayes, also of St. Anicet. Stephane Hayes, 19, a passenger in the 1979 Ford, was more seriously injured.

Officer Gilbert Beaulieu of the Valleyfield Municipal Police, was dispatched to the scene of the accident and took charge of the investigation.

He was helped in his work by officers of the Valleyfield detachment of the QPP.

The accident victims were taken by ambulance to the Valleyfield Hospital Centre.

Traffic at the scene of the accident was interrupted for over half an hour.

An autopsy will be made on the bodies of the victims at the Montreal "Institut médico-légal" in order to determine the cause of death. It could be that a heart attack was the cause of the accident.
