Allister E. McArthur of Cherry Bank Farms dies at 73

Allister Elliot McArthur of Cherry Bank Farms, Howick, Quebec, passed away at the Barrie Memorial Hospital, Ormstown, Quebec, March 21, 1986.

During his full 73 years, Allister took great pride in dairy farming specializing in Ayrshire cattle. Cherry Bank bred and developed the highest scoring classified herd of Ayrshires on the continent with a herd score of 91.32% which included the highest scoring home-bred cow of the breed, score 97%. In 1960 - the year of its inception - Allister received the Superior Breeder Award. During that same year, he served as President of the Ayrshire Breeders' Association of Canada. He was a director of said Association for eight years. In 1961, Allister accepted an assignment with the Advanced Registry Board as Type Classifier for four dairy breeds - Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey and Jersey.

In 1971 he was invited by the Ayrshire Society of Great Britain and Ireland to serve as a consultant in introducing a Type

Classification Programme in Great Britain. Allister returned to Great Britain in 1972, again on request of the Ayrshire Society, for a two month period to promote the above mentioned programme giving type demonstrations throughout England and Scotland as well as training classifiers.

In June of 1975, under the auspices of CUSO, Allister visited Cuba to help establish a classification programme.

A well known judge, Allister judged many fairs in all dairy breeds. Among them in The Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in

Toronto, which he judged eleven times in four breeds: the Canadian National Exhibition; the Atlantic Winter Fair; Amherst Winter Fair; Charlottetown; Truro; Fredericton; Quebec; Sherbrooke, the Pacific National Exhibition, Vancouver, Klondike Days, Edmonton, the Calgary Stampede, New York State Fair, Illinois State Fair, the Royal Highland Show, Scotland, the Royal Adelaide Show, Australia, the Royal Melbourne Show, Australia. He also judged many other smaller fairs.

Allister served his community as a member and chairman of the local School Board and as a member of the Georgetown Presbyterian Kirk Session. He was also Past Master of Glenorm Lodge No. 86 AF-AM.

Allister leaves to mourn his wife of almost 52 years, Freida (Kerr), a son, Alvin, his wife Allana (Marshall) and their daughter Shelley; a daughter, Sheila, her husband Milton Reddick, and their two sons, Jeremy and David. He is also survived by one brother, G. Arnold of Hudson Heights.
