## Tribute to the Late Lloyd Sproule

It was with a deep sense of loss and sadness that relatives and friends from near and far learned of the passing of Arthur Lloyd Sproule at the Montreal General Hospital on March 14, 1986 after four months of illness.

Born at Tatehurst on March 1, 1915, he was the son of James C. Sproule and his wife, Sarah McGill, and the youngest in a family of seven. He received his education at Tatehurst School and Ormstown Academy.

After spending several years with his brother, Thomas, on the home farm, he purchased "Bid-a-Wee" Farm from the late James and Jean Hunter on what is now called Highway 138A, in the Spring of 1946, and began what turned out to be a very busy, successful mixed farming operation which continued through his lifetime.

On July 27, 1946 he was married to Janet Ruby MacDougall, friend and neighbor from childhood days, and to this happy union were born four children.

Of a quiet, kindly disposition with a good sense of humour and wit,

he was well liked and respected, and was always ready to lend a helping hand. He took great pride in his family and home and provided real leadership through the years.

Lloyd was a faithful member of St. Paul's United Church having served as elder for many years and was currently Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

He took a keen interest in people both young and old and in community life. He served for many years as a director of the Mutual Fire Insurance Co. of St. Malachie d'Ormstown and also of the S.M.A.I. du District de Beauharnois.

He and his wife were privileged to travel to many interesting places, most memorable of which were a trip to Great Britain and London at the time of the Royal wedding in July 1981, and as recently as July 1985 when they enjoyed a most wonderful trip to Western Europe and visited six countries.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his wife Ruby, Jean and her husband Roland Leger of Montreal, James and his wife Marian,

Donald of Ormstown and Janet and her husband Gary Russell of Fermont, Quebec, four grandchildren, Pamela and Michael Leger, Sarah Russell and Emily Sproule.

Also surviving are his sister, Edith (Mrs. R. English) and two brothers Douglas and Clifford and several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his brothers, Wallace, Thomas and Austin.

The funeral service was held from St Paul's United Church on March 17 at 2 p.m. with the minister, Rev. Oliver Carmichael officiating, assisted by Rev. Malcolm Cogswell of Howick.

The hymns sung, with Mrs. John Wallace as organist, were 'The Lord's My Shepherd' and 'What a friend we have in Jesus', favorites of the deceased, and the choir rendered beautifully 'How Great Thou Art'.
