Dr. Smaill, aged 74, dies after lengthy illness

Family, relatives, friends and associates were saddened by the recent death of Dr. Stanton Smaill, aged 74, at the Montreal General Hospital on the morning of June 15, 1986 after a lengthy illness.

Stanton Sutherland "Stantie" Smaill was born on August 25, 1911 in Huntingdon, Que., the son of John Smaill and his wife, Mary Sutherland. Dr. Smaill was predeceased by his sister, the late Aileen Crawford.

Dr. Smaill received his elementary and high school education in Huntingdon, graduating in 1929, then went on to study dentistry at McGill University. In

1937, he graduated from McGill taking both the Montreal Dental Club gold medal and the College of Dental Surgeons of the Province of Quebec prize for first rank standing.

After graduation, Dr. Smaill interned at the Montreal General Hospital, later teaching dentistry on the staff of that same institution.

During World War Two, Dr. Smaill served in the Canadian Dental Corps where he attained the rank of major. In 1945, he returned to Montreal to practise dentistry in the Drummond Medical Building until his retirement in 1981.

Dr. Smaill is survived by his wife, Pauline Frances Beaton and three sons, Stanton, Stephen and Douglas.

Funeral services were held at the Kelly Funeral Home Chapel in Huntingdon, on Tuesday June 17, 1986. The Rev. Gordon Bannerman delivered an appropriate sermon, expressing the idea that one should strive to be "accomplished" in life, something that the late Stanton Sutherland Smaill most certainly was.

Burial was in the Smaill family plot at the Huntingdon Protestant Cemetery.
