Sergeant-detective Philippe Cardinal dies at 53

Philippe Cardinal, who was a sergeant with the Huntingdon Municipal Police, died after a lengthy illness around 1 a.m. on Saturday, Aug. 16.

The funeral service was held in the church of St. Joseph's Parish in Huntingdon on Monday, Aug. 18 at 11 a.m.

Cardinal was the victim of an implacable illness - bone cancer. For the last few years, he fought a gallant battle against it. But a few weeks ago, he had to be hospitalized in Montreal, then was later transferred to the Ormstown Barrie Memorial Hospital.

Cardinal started with the Huntingdon Municipal Police on October 4, 1960, as a special constable. In September 1961, he became permanent with the municipal force. He was promoted to the grade of Sergeant on March 15, 1965. And in March 1974, he became sergeant detective, in charge of criminal investigations.

During his career as police officer, Cardinal followed many courses. He

took police management courses at the Police Institut in Nicolet, special courses at the Valleyfield CEGEP, courses in Civil Protection, and recycling courses in Nicolet. He also followed a course given by the RCMP on drugs.

Also in the last few years, Cardinal acted as building inspector for the municipalities of Huntingdon and Godmanchester.

"After 25 years serving in the police force with him," said Huntingdon Police Chief Joffre L'Heureux, "I find it very hard to see him gone."

The Chief describes Cardinal as a good policeman, always up to par to solve criminal cases he was investigating.

Cardinal leaves to mourn his wife and three children.
