He was chairman of the Board of Stewards of Franklin United Church for several years some time ago.

His health was poor for the past 12 years.

He is survived by his wife, Edith, his son, Charles and daughter Ann, his daughter-in-law Trudy (née Berner) and son-in-law Peter Lamoureux, as well as four well-loved grandchildren, Andrew, Mark, and Jeremy Harvey, and Danielle Lamoureux.
