## The late Isabel Foster's life revolved around the Gore road

On August 1, 1986, Margaret Isabel Foster passed away in the Barrie Memorial Hospital, Ormstown, leaving to mourn her loss, her one brother Melvin, in Cornwall, Ont. and many deeply saddened friends.

She was born on March 13, 1925, daughter of Lily B. Howe and W. Cyril Foster, both deceased. Isabel lived all her life on the Gore Road.

Educated in Gore School and Athelstan Elementary School, she was a bright and intelligent student, and would dearly have loved to further her education, but circumstances forbade it.

Shortly thereafter she began to work for Leach Textiles in Huntingdon in the Burling and Mending Department. There she met Dorothy Stevenson, who was to be a true and lifelong friend.

Then came wartime and Isabel took a position in Power Boat, a munitions factory in Montreal. She then lived for a few years with relatives Alice and Nelson Farquhar.

When this job was over, Isabel returned home to help with the care of a beloved grandfather, Robert Howe, a renowned gentleman and champion curler of Huntingdon and area. When he passed away, Isabel's mother was taken ill and spent seven long years in bed, with the ever faithful Isabel in attendance.

During these years, she had a true and loving friend, Merle Anderson, but then one night in 1954, Merle lost control of the truck he was driving and it overturned, crushing him beneath it.

In 1958, her mother passed away, and Isabel remained to make a home for her father.

At this time, Isabel took employment in Heath's Department Store. When that business closed, Isabel began to work as cashier with John Thompson who had recently purchased the business of the late Tony Cappiello. She remained with Thompson's (later Tishlee) until illness forced her retirement.

From that time on, her illness became more and more serious, and she spent the best part of two years in pain and misery which she bore with the most admirable courage. There was never a complaint, never a "why me". She always answered the "How are you?" with "not bad."

Isabel will be sadly missed by all who knew and loved her, as a true and generous friend.

Interment was in Gore Cemetery. Pallbearers were Carl Anderson, Clark Henderson, Frank Mason, Jim McCaig, Kevin Dineen and Mervyn Graham.
