Albert 'Tibby' Hebert dead after brief illness

Albert (Tibby) Hebert, born in Adams, Mass. on November 3, 1906, died on Oct. 30, 1986 - at the "Centre Hospitalier de Valleyfield", after a brief illness.

Tibby was the son of Blanche Gregoire and Norbert Hebert of Massachusetts.

Following the death of his father, in 1920, when Tibby was 14 years of age, his mother moved to Valleyfield with her five children. Tibby was predeceased by two brothers, William and Victor. His two sisters, Roma (Mrs. Paul Gervais) and Lillian (Mrs. Yvan Brassard), still reside in the Valleyfield area.

In June 1934, after a seven-year courtship, Tibby married Emily, elder daughter of James

Talbot and Anne Holden of Valleyfield.

Emily is the elder sister of Dr. Ernest Talbot and Mrs. Eva Poirier. Their parents James and Anne emigrated from England in 1901.

From 1934 to 1944 Tibby was self-employed at the Champlain Garage in Huntingdon.

In 1944 he commenced employment as mechanic with the Dominion Textile Company in Valleyfield, where he subsequently took up residence with his family on Boulevard du Havre.

He remained with the company for 27 years, until his retirement at age 65.

Besides being recognized as a good mechanic, Tibby enjoyed hunting, and was an ardent fisherman, a sport he indulged in

during many happy summers with his family at their cottage in Port Lewis.

Tibby is survived by his wife, Emily, two sons, Ronald and Lynn, and four grandchildren, Carole, (twins) Scott and Leanne, (twins), and Todd. Ronald resides in London, Ont. with his family, and Lynn resides in Brockville, Ont.

The Requiem Mass was celebrated at 11 a.m. on Nov. 3, at Notre-Dame-de-Bellerive Church, with many old friends and neighbors joining the family in their farewell to Tibby on what was to have been his 80th birthday.

His ashes were then interred in the Valleyfield cemetery.

Traffic death

A 27-year-old man was killed in a traffic accident on Friday, Nov. 28 around 8 p.m. opposite no. 1322, Highway 138 in Godmanchester.

His name was Alain Pellat of Laval. He died after being hit by a car as he stood on the road.

At the time of the accident, the victim was cleaning up glass debris on the road. It seems a case of soft drinks fell onto the pavement from the truck he was driving. He stopped his vehicle to pick up the broken glass.

The young man was hit by a car driven by Serge Vaillancourt, 23 of Huntingdon.

Pellat was taken to Ormstown's Barrie Memorial Hospital where the doctor in attendance pronounced him dead.

Officer Robert Verges of the Huntingdon Provincial Police is in charge of the investigation. He advised District Coroner Dr. Georges Lefebvre of the accident and made a report to the Crown prosecutor.
