Ormstown loses one of its oldest citizens, Mrs. Annie Harrigan, almost 97

Ormstown lost one of its oldest citizens on January 2, 1987 in the passing of Mrs. Annie Harrigan.

A resident of Walshaven for almost eight years, she lived in Centre d'Accueil for the past four years under the tender, loving care of the administration, staff and many friends.

Born on January 14, 1890 in Glasgow, Scotland, she came to Canada at the age of four years, growing up in Dewittville.

When she was 19 she married William Harrigan. To this union nine children were born, six of whom still survive.

Her husband predeceased her in 1957, her eldest son Middleton in 1940, her eldest daughter, Daisy in 1968 and her youngest daughter, Betty in 1972. Shortly after her death the following telegram was received by her daughter, Pansy, from the National Spiritual

Assembly of the Bahai's of Canada:

"National Spiritual Assembly of the Bahai's of Canada grieved to learn of the passing of dear Annie Harrigan, whose many years of Baha'i service were characterized by her steadfast, enthusiastic and adventurous spirit and were marked always by good cheer, partially in these final failing years.

We extend to her family and friends our heartfelt condolences and assurances of ardent prayers for the progress of Annie's bright soul".

Her last wish was granted on January 4 when she had a Baha'i funeral service from the McGerrigle Funeral Home in Ormstown.

Bob Mather, a dear friend gave the eulogy, speaking of her buoyancy and zest for life, how she was always interested in things spiritual, a creative person who made friends with

young and old.

The Prayer for the Departed was chanted in Arabic by Milook Agigi, a young Baha'i woman from Montreal. This is a prayer given by the new Prophet, Baha'u'llah, over a century ago.

Four of her grandsons were pallbearers: Jerry Harrigan of Huntingdon, Michael Castagner of North Miami Beach, Florida, Peter LaCroix of Woodacre, California, and Murray English of Ormstown, Que.

Before and after the service Baha'i music was beautifully played by Mrs. John Wallace.

A memorial service is being planned for Mrs. Harrigan at the Baha'i Centre on Pine Avenue in Montreal by the Montreal Bahai's. It will be on January 21, 1987 at 2 p.m. and are welcome.

Burial will be in the Protestant cemetery in Huntingdon in the spring.
