Traffic fatality

A 36-year-old woman was killed in a road accident which took place on Wednesday, Sept. 30 around 7:30 a.m.

The victim was Thérèse Tessier, residing at 104 New Erin Road in the Township of Godmanchester. She died as a result of a skull fracture.

At the time of the accident, Mrs. Tessier was travelling on the Chemin Seigneurial, driving a 1980 Ford Van. It appears she

lost control of her vehicle at the top of a hill, then skidded back and forth across the gravel road, coming down the hill to eventually turn over a few times.

Officer Jean-Pierre Bruneau of the Huntingdon detachment of the Provincial Police was called to the scene of the tragic accident. He was able to immediately determine that the vehicle

was a total loss.

As for the victim, she was taken by Montpetit Ambulance to the Barrie Memorial Hospital in Ormstown where she was pronounced dead on arrival by Dr. Yee.

The precise circumstances of this road fatality will forever remain a mystery as there was only one vehicle involved - the victim was alone - and there were no witnesses.

Former MP for St-Jean dies suddenly

Walter B. Smith, former Member of Parliament for St-Jean County died suddenly at his home in Hemmingford on Saturday, Oct. 3 at the age of 75.

Mr. Smith sat in the House of Commons in Ottawa from 1968 to 1979 as a member of the Liberal Party.

Mr. Smith is survived by his wife Gaétane (née

Payant), and his children: Pauline (Réal Germain), Gerald (Nadine Forman), Claudette (Marcel Brosseau). Also grandchildren Luc, Marc, Lynn Germain, Stéphane and Annie Brosseau and many other relatives.

The funeral service is being held today, Oct. 7 at 2 p.m. at St. Romain Church, Hemmingford.
