Allan's Corners native turns 100

Arthur Forrester was born at Allan's Corners in Howick, Que. on March 17, 1888.

On March 25, 1913, he married Daisy Henderson of the Gore, and moved to Swift Current, Sask. where he was employed by W.W. Cooper, General Merchant, from 1913 to 1915.

From there, he moved to Aneroid, Sask. where he went into business for himself and operated a general store and hardware from 1915 to 1938.

He survived the Great Depression of the thirties and sold the business to Sid Corbin of Aneroid. Arthur was a hard-working member of the Aneroid

community and was Past Master of the Aneroid Masonic Lodge.

Arthur and his wife moved to Regina in 1939. Arthur travelled back and forth to Aneroid where he farmed until 1952 when they moved to Calgary. Then in 1956, they moved again, this time to Victoria.

Mrs. Forrester passed away in 1959, and Mr. Forrester moved into Duncan Manor in 1977, and in 1986 to Cowichan Lodge, Duncan, where he has resided ever since.

Family members include his son Mel of Calgary, Alta., daughters Audrey Fraser of Kelowna, B.C. and Lois Garnett of Mill

Bay, B.C. Also seven grandchildren, and seven great-grandchildren.

Mr. Forrester is the last remaining of a family of seven children and therefore has been special, not only to his immediate family but also to his many nieces and nephews.

A celebration was held in Cowichan Lodge on March 17, 1988, with 125 friends and family members in attendance. Out-of-town guests travelled from Quebec, Alberta, various parts of B.C. and California, Oregon and South America.

Arthur proved he is still in good spirits and good voice by singing "I'll take you home again Kathleen" and "Whispering Hope", to a delighted audience.
