## Missing young woman and car found in bottom of Lake St. Francis After 7 months, and a few feet from where she disappeared

When on Saturday, May 28, the Provincial Police pulled out a car with a body in it, at the federal wharf in St. Anicet, they finally held the key to the mysterious disappearance seven months earlier of a young woman named Kathy Febrile a resident of a suburb near Cornwall, Ontario.

The young woman had been reported missing on October 25, having last been seen in St. Anicet, when she hurriedly left the Lakeview Inn, after having an argument with her boyfriend.

It took the police almost nine hours on Saturday to retrieve the car and body from the water at the St. Anicet wharf, near the Jules-Léger Historical

Park, not far from the hotel where it all began.

The police action attracted about 200 onlookers from all over the area, starting when three divers, hired by friends of Kathy Febrile's family made the gruesome discovery at 11:18 a.m. of a body sitting at the wheel of a car at the bottom of the lake.

The vehicle was resting in about 10 feet of water, at some 45 feet from the wharf. Upon checking, the divers found out that the car was a blue 1987 Toyota Tercel, with license plate number 523-CSY. This car had not been seen either since the disappearance of Kathy Febrile.

## 38-year-old man drowns in gravel pit

A 38-year-old man died in a tragic way on Friday, May 27, as he drowned in a gravel pit on Rang St-Charles in Cazaville.

Guy Grenon, domiciled at 523, route 132 in St. Anicet, died after falling in a water-filled pond located at the pit.

Officers of the Huntingdon detachment of the Provincial Police say that Guy Grenon was seen alive for the last time around 4 p.m. last Friday.

Later that night, his father called the Sûreté du Québec to report his son was missing. That's when the search began.

His 10-wheel truck was seen at the gravel pit, with the hood open. In looking around the truck, a water container was found. The immediate conclusion was that the young man had probably drowned.

According to police, the victim probably went to the ditch to get some water for

his overheated truck. He may have lost his footing and have fallen into the water. The young man didn't know how to swim.

The body was found by the St. Anicet volunteer firemen when they dragged the bottom of the pond.

Coroner Georges Lefebvre, advised of the incident, closed the investigation with the mention: accidental death by drowning.
