Two elderly people killed in car accident on Plank Rd.

Two elderly people from Valleyfield, Mr. and Mrs. René Poirier (nee Claire Rhéaume) died following an accident which took place on the Plank Road in Godmanchester on Wednesday, Aug. 3 around 2 p.m.

René Poirier, 73, and his wife Claire, 72, were travelling in a north to south direction in a 1984 Renault Alliance when their car collided with the 1985 Dodge Omni, driven by Thomas Deegan, 19, of Hinchinbrooke who was going in the opposite direction on the Plank Road.

It seems Mr. Poirier made a right turn to get onto the Chemin de l'église, towards Sainte-Barbe, when the collision took place.

The impact was quite violent as Deegan's car hit the other vehicle on the passenger side, causing important damages and, unfortunately, the instant

death of Mrs. Poirier.

M. Poirier was taken by ambulance to Barrie Memorial in Ormstown and then onto the Montreal General where he died.

A passenger in Deegan's car, Heidi Cavanagh of Markham, Ont. aged 17, suffered a broken leg and cuts in the accident, while Tom had cuts to the nose and forehead.

Woman killed by lightning

A young mother of 32 was killed by lightning around 4 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 5 at Camping Lac des Pins in St-Antoine-Abbé.

Lise Savage Lafleche of Valleyfield was killed instantly, under the horrified eyes of her family.

A third car involved in the accident was driven by Denise Vachon of Saint-Anicet. Her 1988 Ford Topaz was damaged following the collision between the other two cars. The damage is assessed at over \$500. Fortunately, Mrs. Vachon was not hurt. She was travelling from north to south on the Plank road, following Mr. Poirier's car.

husband and two children to put away everything that was outside into the family trailer.

This is what they were doing when the victim, holding an aluminum chair, was struck by a fatal bolt of lightning.

Taken to the Barrie Memorial Hospital in Ormstown, the victim was pronounced dead on arrival.

Community saddened by death of lifelong businessman

The community of Huntingdon and surrounding area was saddened by the recent death of lifelong businessman Harold Stark.

He was the third son born to John and Margaret (Feeny) of New Erin, Que.

Growing up in the "Depression Years" of the thirties, life was hard, and Harold, like many small boys with ambition and determination, would undertake most any job available, to earn a few cents pay.

His father John having died at a young age, Harold, with his mother and two brothers, had to leave the New Erin farm and move to Huntingdon.

Having left school at St. Joseph's at a very early age, Harold became employed as an electrician helper with Leslie Sherry, and helped install the wiring in many area homes, in preparation for the coming of electricity.

Later he worked in construction, until 1950 when he purchased his first gravel truck from Herman Saumier. In 1959 Harold married Shirley McNaughton, and they built their new home on what was then considered the "edge of town", beside Rt. 202.

Over the years he expanded his trucking business and provided a much needed service in the community. Not only did

Harold haul gravel, crushed rock, top soil or whatever else was called for, but he also dealt in hay and straw on both sides of the Canada-U.S. border, and also in Ontario.

Harold has always enjoyed helping young people and he had a "father-son" relationship with several young men who later worked for him in his trucking business.

Although Harold never became a member of any of the local organizations, he was always generous with his help for various groups such as the Huntingdon Agricultural Society, the Athelstan Sports Association, and others. Many a parade float was assembled in his garage, with Harold not only lending a hand but his tools as well.

On June 8, 1988, following many months of suffering, Harold died at the Barrie Memorial Hospital in Ormstown, only 10 days

prior to his sixtieth birthday.

He leaves to mourn his loss: his loving wife Shirley, nephews Brad and Rick, who were like his sons, a brother-in-law, three sisters-in-law, two aunts and many other nieces, nephews and cousins.

He was predeceased by both his parents and his two brothers Raymond and Wilbert.

The funeral service was held in St. Joseph's Church on June 11, with Father Hubert Hamelin conducting the service, ably assisted by Joel Den-Haan, United Church student minister.

The pallbearers were Clarence Moore, Dave Rennie, Donald McGregor, George Lindsay, Ivan Graham, and Donald Grant, with interment in the Huntingdon Protestant Cemetery.

The numerous floral tributes, mass cards and donations to the Canadian Cancer Society, and other organizations, as well as the large visitation, stand as a testimony to the regard in which he was held in the community.

Harold will be greatly missed by all.
