## A tribute to Jean-Claude Lefebvre

Jean Claude Lefebvre was a kind and gentle man, and those of us who worked with him have lost a good friend - one who will ever remain amongst the "special" people we were privileged to know.

I first met Jean-Claude some 40 years ago when I started work at the Gleaner. At that time he was editor and managing director of La Gazette de Valleyfield, which was then an entirely separate publication from the Gleaner itself.

He came to Huntingdon each Thursday to oversee the printing, and in his dealings with the Gleaner

office staff and print shop employees was always considerate, cooperative and consistent. He insisted on quality, and he got it without being demanding, derogatory or dogmatic.

He had a manner of dealing with all classes of people as if he belonged - and I never heard him belittle or demean anyone. In fact, his quiet comments restored confidence and gave one increased self-esteem. If he had anger it was directed at injustice and irresponsibility.

Our paths crossed from time to time over the years and he always had time to stop and exchange news

and views of events and happenings and to ask how things were going with me. It had been some four years since I had seen him until I met him again at the Academy Reunion and I received the warmest of greetings! He seemed especially pleased to hear we had moved back to Huntingdon.

I am sure many will miss Jean-Claude. He was a concerned, caring person - a gentleman in every sense of the word. He left each life he touched just a little bit better for his having lived.
