Many, many other fundraising and service organizations also benefited from Roberta's magnanimous generosity in giving of herself.

Roberta resided on the old route 138 and her gentle home as a world of literature, theatre, poetry. It was also a house filled with artifacts collected from all over the world representing the past, present and future, and rolled into on magnificent cultural Josephs Coat of Many Colors.

Roberta enjoyed hearing about the gypsy adventures of the road recounted to her by Donny after his return from a long haul on the highways, and she treasured the little secrets and time she shared with all of her grandchildren. She eagerly anticipated the exhilarating visits and letters from Robin and her

son-in-law Wayne, and she especially enjoyed the intimate moments spent with Jean, her daughter-in-law, confiding and recounting the events of the day over a steaming cup of coffee.

During the past few years Roberta took more time out to enjoy her graceful home. She would spend many pleasant hours putting around her old-fashioned floral gardens rearranging the rambling rock gardens or planting reams of rainbow hued flowers, her ever faithful dogs trailing behind her.

Her favorite hideaway was down behind her beloved home on the old 138. It was here she would escape to the woodland world of her Hollow creatures. She loved to watch the droning-iridescent dragonflies and sleepy mud turtles lazing amid the forests of nodding bulrushes. This is where she could relax and escape the pressures of her busy, busy days. This was the world she relished the most.
