Man found dead while picking wild leeks on Covey Hill

A Ste. Martine resident was found dead on Covey Hill Road in Franklin on May 27 after having been reported missing.

The victim, Mr. Claude Cousineau, age 58 years of the Rang Roy in Ste.Martine, left his home on May 26 to go pick wild leeks in a field on Covey Hill Road in Franklin Centre, and when he did not return on

May 27, his family called the Ste.Martine Quebec Police Force to report him missing.

Around 11h45 a.m., the QPF received a phone call from a passerby on Covey Hill Road who reported a car parked in a field. He later discovered a body on the ground.

Officer Gilles Plourde of the Huntingdon detachment

of the QPr was dispatched to the scene and began an investigation.

The man was identified on the scene and officers of Ste. Martine were called in to verify if this was indeed the man reported missing early that morning.

Also called to the scene were Officer Pierre Boivin from the Crimes Against Persons Unit of the

QPF Montreal District and an officer of the Identification Unit.

The victim was taken to Huntingdon by Montpetit Morgue then sent to Montreal's Institut Medico-Légal for an autopsy.

According to sources, it would seem to be a natural death, probably from cardiac failure.
