Lila Elizabeth Winter passed away

Aunt Lila passed away at the Barrie Memorial Hospital, Ormstown, Quebec, on May 9, 1989, at the age of seventy-seven years. She was the only daughter of the late John Lindsay Winter and Elizabeth Fleming.

Aunt Lila was a true and strong believer in a good education, her family and homelife.

As an educator, she started to teach school in September 1931 at the age of 19 and continued in this profession for 36 years. She taught in one room schoolhouses on the Covey Hill, Rawdon and Hinchinbrooke to the more sophisticated school systems of the 1950's and 1960's.

During those years, her chosen career took her to the Chambly-Richelieu and St. Lambert School Boards. She was always very proud of her students throughout those years. When she was still teaching and even after her retirement in June 1967, she often spoke of those she taught. In fact, some still kept in contact with her through letters or visits to her home in Ormstown.

She was highly respected by her co-workers and friends in the educational system. On November 17, 1966, at the 102nd Annual Convention, she was one of the recipients of the Order of Scholastic Merit award, from the Provincial Association of Protestant Teachers of Quebec, which is one of the highest awards that can be bestowed upon a person in this profession.

She was not only a five day teacher because returning home for the weekends, she took a great interest in the education of her nieces and nephews. She was always interested

in our school work and report cards. She was always there to lend a helping hand, even if it meant tutoring us through the weekend or a summer vacation. She even supported us when we wanted to further our education in a chosen profession.

Aunt Lila believed in and was a strong supporter of her family and homelife. Her family, whom she dearly loved and was devoted to, are Ross her brother, Verna her sister-in-law, nieces Florence, Dorothy, Joyce and Christine, and nephews Johnnie (deceased), Donald and Ronald.

She spent her weekends and summer vacations at home with the Barr's.

She was a woman who always took time to enjoy people, things and surroundings, whether it was Mother Nature's landscape, her flower garden or a card she had received from a friend or relative.

She was always able to bring out the beauty of the moment whatever it might have been.

She was a faithful member of the St. Paul's United Church and the St. Paul's Women's group. She was always ready to support or participate in the activities of the church.

During the last couple of years, Aunt Lila was not physically able to maintain her own home, she became a part of Valera Moore's household, where she was well cared for and loved.

Aunt Lila was not a physically strong woman, but made up for it with her mind and strong determination. She was always up to date on current events and the world of which she had widely travelled.

Her strong determination and her positive outlook on life were an inspiration to all those who knew her.

Her funeral service was held at the Chapel of the McGerrigle Funeral Home Inc. on May 11, 1989.
