A tribute to Miss Laura Currie

On Wednesday afternoon, September 6, word came that Laura Currie had suffered a heart attack and had died to the Barrie Memorial Hospital.

Laura has lived for many years in the same upstairs apartment on Châteauguay Street, and every day, often twice a day she came down those stairs to go to the post-office, the stores and to visit with all the friends and neighbours she would meet on "front street".

For many years, too, people depended on Laura to make their dresses for special occasions and do their alterations, and one was often amazed at how she could fashion something wearable out of practically nothing?

She made quilts, and one lady who had a large family used to mention that every had a "Laura Currie" quilt on it. Children adored her

stuffed animals, and making them gave her much pleasure.

The Rev. Neil Wallace, in his remarks at the funeral service, painted such a true picture of Laura's life that I asked his permission to copy it in part.

"Laura was quiet, shy and unassuming, and every Sunday as I looked out on the Congregation there, invariably, was Laura in her pen at the back of the Church. She enjoyed seeing with children, and children enjoyed her too, because she was soft and kind and gentle."

"She would tell of the time her niece had brought her a stray kitten to look after over-night. That was eleven years ago and that kitten had become one of the fattest, most pampered cats in the country. That cat was her dearest companion, and it was a deep loss

for her recently when that dear cat died. If it be true that animals have souls, then we can be sure that God has re-united two friends.

"Laura had a spirit, a feeling for life and a feeling for God that could only ring a note of hope. She lived 88 healthy years, and put her mark on this community in unassuming but real ways.

"We can only rejoice that she was able to live independently and contentedly on her own to the very end. We give thanks that she left us peacefully, with no pain or suffering and we are content to release her into God's safe keeping, knowing that she is in the company of all those loved ones who have gone before."
