Long-time publisher Howard Lyons dies

Those who know the Fort Covington Sun newspaper, knew its long-time publisher Howard G. Lyons who passed away at his home on November 4 at the age of 81 following an extended illness.

When former Gleaner publisher Keith Howden purchased the Sun in 1971, Howard Lyons and his wife, Marion, continued to work at the news office. He had owned the paper from 1930 to 1965, taking over from his father Isaac who died in 1929.

Mrs. Lyons, the former Marion H. Wilson, was his business partner and she recalls that his whole life revolved around the community newspaper. In earlier years much of the type was set by hand and he operated the Linotype machine. The paper's motto was "Bring You All the News About the Folks You Know."

Mr. Lyons was born in Fort Covington in 1908 and lived his life in the community, becoming involved in

politics, church and Kiwanis. A book on the history of the towns of Bombay, Westville and Fort Covington by author Herbert D.A. Donovan was dedicated to Mr. and Mrs. Lyons because much of the information was taken from 33 years of reporting found in the Sun's files.
