Dalton Ray Stark, 56, passed away Saturday afternoon, November 25, 1989, at the Montreal General Hospital, after a lengthy illness. Born in Huntingdon January 14, 1933, he was the son of the late Angus Stark and the late Ina Elliott Stark.

Former resident of Huntingdon dies suddenly in Indiana

On November 23, 1989, Thanksgiving Day in the U.S., relatives and friends were shocked to hear of the sudden death of Harold (Sonny) Cosgrove.

He was born on September 12, 1944, son of the late Harold Cosgrove and Rosemary Ouimet of Huntingdon, Québec.

In 1970 he married Joyce Ann Murphy of Cornwall, Ont., daughter of the late John and Gladys Murphy, formerly of Dewittville, Québec. Of this union three children were born, Shannon, Shawn and Kelly Dale.

He is survived by his wife and two children; Kelly Dale predeceased him. He is also survived by his mother and step-father Rosemary and Charles Swift; brother Richard; step-brothers Michel and Claude (Sandra) Swift; brothers-in-law Dale (Rose) and Garry (Bernadette) Murphy; sisters-in-law Leona Murphy and Donald (Mrs. Bernard Turgeon); several nieces and nephews and grand-nieces and grand-nephews.

Harold attended St. Joseph's and Notre Dame schools in Huntingdon and graduated from High School at Regiopolis College in Kingston, Ontario. In 1964, after one year at Loyola College in Montreal, he enlisted in the United States Air Force for four years, and during this time, spent a year at Tan

San Nhut Air Base in Vietnam.

Following his discharge from the Air Force, he settled in Malone, N.Y. and was employed by General Motors of Massena, N.Y. for nineteen years until he was transferred to Bedford, Indiana, in 1987. The family settled nearby in Mitchell, Ind.

He was a great lover of hockey and was very active with minor hockey for over twenty years, both in Malone and in Mitchell.

A high tribute was paid to him by one of his former minor players, Michael Holland Jr. of Malone. Michael said that one year he was having a difficult year in school and that he received much encouragement from his hockey coach, Mr. Cosgrove. At a tournament, played in Malone, N.Y., Mike said that he looked at his coach and said to himself, "I've got to get a goal for Mr. Cosgrove". He got a goal, and it turned out to be the winning goal. His coach gave Mike the winning puck. On the day of the funeral, this young hockey player tossed his cherished puck into the grave of his coach. Truly an act of admiration.

On the Saturday evening after his death, Rev. Father Dan Armstrong of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Mitchell Ind. conducted a prayer service at the Haverly Funeral Home,

where over two hundred of his co-workers and friends and a minor hockey team, of which Shawn is a goaler, paid their respects.

Harold was a past Commander of the American Legion, Post 219, of Malone, N.Y. A Legion Memorial Service held at the Kelly Funeral Home was attended by a large number of members from Post 219. Members of The Catholic Women's League of St. Joseph Parish, accompanied by Rev. Gabriel Clément also attended in a body for their prayer service.

A funeral Mass was held in St. Joseph Church in Huntingdon with Father G. Clément officiating, assisted by Father J. Marcell of Herdman, Québec, and Father Allan Shnob, a friend of the family, from West Chazy, N.Y. The readings were by James Cosgrove, cousin of Harold. The poem "Footprints In The Sand" was beautifully read by Mrs. Bea Ouimet of California and "When Irish Eyes Are Smiling" was appropriately sung by Mrs. Bernadette Murphy of Ottawa, Ont.

Burial was in St. Joseph's Cemetery in Huntingdon, Qué. Pall Bearers were Richard Cosgrove, Donald Ouimet, Sandy Mac Donell, Larry Bradley, Bernard Desnoyers and Bernard Turgeon.
