The late Harold Tattrie

On Thursday, June 21, death came suddenly to Harold W. Tattrie at the age of 75 years.

Before moving to Dundee, the deceased lived in Chateauguay. He was employed by the P.Q. Canadian National Railway and at the time of his retirement was a Conductor on the Montreal-Toronto run.

The Tattries bought the house formerly owned by the late Mrs. Grace Kerr, and every winter was spent in Florida. They usually returned North in April, and he never failed to call and tell me about his winter holiday, so that I could make note of it in my column.

This past winter hadn't been a good one for Harold, as he had had a triple-by-pass done in a Florida hospital. He remarked that he was lucky in that he had worked in the United States long enough to give him American coverage as well as the coverage he had under Medicare.

Mr. Tattrie was a charming gentleman who possessed a very pleasing personality. He made friends easily, and showed a keen interest in all his fellowmen.

Early this year, the Tattries sold their property in Dundee and has moved to an apartment in St-Anicet, Qué.

A memorial service was held at the Kelly Funeral Home in Huntingdon on Monday afternoon, June 25, at 2 p.m. Rev. Neil Wallace led the service, and burial of ashes in the Field of Honour at Pointe Claire will take place at a later date. Fellow masons also paid their respects to a deported brother at this well attended memorial service.

The community extends sympathy to his wife, Jeannine Desroches, his two sons, Gary and Donald, and his four grandchildren in the loss of a husband, father and grandfather.

William Roach, a 36 year-old resident of Fairhaven Blvd, in Hinchinbrooke, was the victim of a fatal accident that occurred on June 29 at 8:15 p.m. on the 4th Concession Road in Elgin.

According to Huntingdon QPF reports, Mr. Roach apparently lost control of his 1990 Chevy pickup truck on a curve

which had been recently repaired by the Ministry of Transport. Officer Sandra Hippolyte, assisted by officer Leon Gilissen, arrived at the scene. The body was sent by Montpetit Ambulance Service to the Barrie Memorial where Dr. G. Geukjian signed the death certificate.

Mr. Roach was thrown clear of his vehicle and suffered a broken-neck injury.
