## Work accident claims life of Huntingdon man

A Huntingdon resident, Mr. Srecko Frank, aged 59, was killed in an industrial work accient on August 25.

The deceased, who worked at the Electrolytic Zinc in Valleyfield, was discovered by the plant foreman during his 15-minute interval surveillance tour of the plant on Saturday morning, about 1:20 a.m. Mr. Frank was found with his head wedged in a mobile skinning machine in electrolysis plant No. 2.

Mr. Frank had 29 years of service with Zine and was planning to retire at the end of this year.

At present, no official explanation has been given relative to the actual cause of death. According to certain preliminary information, it appears that the safety guards of this machine were not in place. Mr. Frank was an experienced operator on this machine.

Though the plant section in which Mr. Frank worked was to be closed shortly for modernization, all information received clearly indicated that this section answered all the conditions prescribed by the Commission sur la santé et la sécurité au travail (CSST) and was always in good operating order.

The CSST will make an investigation into the cause of this fatal accident. During that time, this piece of equipment will remain out-of-service.

The last fatal work accident at Zinc occurred in 1975

Funeral services for Mr. Frank were held August 28 at the St. Joseph Church in Huntingdon.
