NOTE OF SYMPATHY

This Community has been greatly saddened to learn of the sudden and untimely death of Kathleen Noonan (née Burgess), on Wednesday, Aug. 15 while she was visiting her nephew, Burton Burgess, in Lorraine, Quebec.

Kay was born on Nov. 10, 1909, in Grande Falls, N.B.

In the early 1940's she met and fell in love with George Noonan of Ottawa, who at the time was a bank clerk in Grande Falls.

The couple were married shortly afterwards in Ottawa.

Soon after the wedding, George was sent overseas on Active Duty, and sadly he was killed during the London blitz. They had only been married for two months.

Kay then decided to move to Valleyfield in 1941, to be near her sister Margaret. (Tom Waldron).

Margaret at that time was an R.N. at the Valleyfield hospital.

For many years until her retirement in 1969, Kay was an employee in the Main office of the old Montreal Cottons.

Over the years she made many friends in the Valleyfield - Huntingdon areas.

For many years, she was also organist at the St. Ignatius Mass.

According to her last wishes, Kay's remains were transported to her old home town of Grande Falls, and placed beside her family. A private funeral service was held there.

She will be sadly missed by her sister, Margaret (now of Napanee, Ont.) and her many friends, especially the St. Ignatius Guild.

The St. Ignatius Guild will be holding a special memorial service for Kay, during the regular 9 a.m. Mass, on Sunday, Sept. 16, in the Chapel of the Dominican Sisters on Larocque Road.

A loving epitaph for Kay would be a Prayer by an unknown Confederate soldier:
