## Gerald Moore remembered on both sides of the border

Gerald C. Moore was a well-known Huntingdon resident active in community groups and his farm businesses. The former U.S. Marine, who served in China during World War II, was given full military honors at his funcral on September 13 and 14 by the Akwesasne Detachment #566 Marine Corps League of Hogansburg, New York.

Gerald C. Moore, an active member and full time supporter of the detachment, was laid to rest in his Marine Corps League blazer uniform, and provided full military honors. Funeral Home services included "The Brief Order for Deceased Marines" accompanied by the "Battle Hymn of the Republic" and the "Marine's Hymn" at appropriate times.

The casket was escorted to the church by the Detachment Commandant, Ceremonial Officer, Honor Guard, Color Guard, Firing Squad, Chaplain, Auxiliary, and marching detail; along with "Honorary Pall Bearer" unit from Huntingdon consisting of Canadian Legion; Canadian Boy Scouts and friends. After a Memorial Service at the church, a graveside ceremony was held including a gun salute, bugler Taps" being played, and the United States flag being presented to the surviving spouse, Mrs. Beryl Moore.

In 1981 he married his second wife, Beryl Jamieson; they had sons John and Clifford. He had 16 grandchildren.

He always enjoyed meeting people and was active in many clubs. Some of his local activities included serving as Vice President and Director of the Huntingdon Fair Board, Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the Huntingdon United Church, and a member of the Chateauguay Valley Antique Association. He was a Past-president of Rotary and recently named a Paul Harris Fellow.

He was also familiar to Valley farmers as the Eastern Canadian top sales agent for Superior Silos. selling bins and running a trucking business. He was the road supervisor for Hinchinbrooke last year and had pioneered that municipality's snow removal in 1945 with a Case tractor and plough when snow banks were three times the height of the tractor.

For the past several years. Mr. Moore has battled cancer. Friends and family say that he gave a strong fight to the last. He will be greatly missed in the community.
