"Father Georges" was a community leader and friend

The funeral services for Canon Georges Quenneville were held on Tuesday, March 5 at the St. Anicet Parish Church by Bishop Robert Lebel of the Valleyfield Diocese.

Father Quenneville died at the Laurent-Bergevin nursing home in Ile Perrot on March 2. He was 72.

Father Georges, as he was known to the people of Huntingdon, left a definite impression on this region. For 12 years, he served as the priest of St. Joseph's in Huntingdon between 1970 and 1982. For the following five years, he was the priest at St. Anicet before taking his retirement due to poor health.

Georges Quenneville was born on May 13, 1918; he was the son of Edgar Quenneville and Eva Archambeault. He was ordained as a priest on May 26, 1945 and later became canon.

Local people have but good memories of Georges Quenneville. He actively participated in the community life of Huntingdon and he knew how to go about

bring together different religions here. Several ecumenical services which annually bring together the pastors from various local churches are the work of Canon Quenneville.

An active member of the Huntingdon Rotary Club, the priest was named a Paul Harris Fellow for his community involvement.

It is important to recall that he was the key person in welcoming a Vietnamese family to town.

The communities of Huntingdon and St. Anicet have certainly lost a friend, their Father Georges.
