Malcolm Brown, 102, Hemmingford's oldest resident passes

Hemmingford's oldest resident, Malcolm Brown, passed away at the Florence Groulx Home on March 6th, 1991 in his 103rd year.

He was born Oct. 5, 1888, one of eight children to James and Sophia Brown of Barrington, Quebec. He worked the family farm until 1948, when he and his wife Clara (nee McCrea) moved to Hemmingford Village. At that time he gave up farming due to ill health.

He served as a councillor for the municipality for some years. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Hemmingford and an elder of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church from the year 1927. A special service was held in 1977 to honour his fifty years as an elder and the fact that he had not missed a Communion Service in that period of time.

While in Hemmingford he picked apples annually until over 90 years of age and kept a large garden until 97 years old, sharing the produce with all. He took part in the Apple Festival parades, played cards on a regular basis and kept house, having lost his wife in 1965. Due to failing health after surgery, he moved to the Groulx Home five years ago.

He is survived by his daughters Ann and husband Jack Harris of Mt. Uniacke, N.S.; Jean and Husband George Norman of Hemmingford, Que.; Grandchildren Sandra Elliot of Arrprior, Ontario; Statia Elliot of Toronto, Ont.; Betty Curry Jeffers of Fort Myers, Florida; Peggy Curry Slachetka of Toronto, Ont.; Bruce Curry of Lacombe, Alberta; and Brent Curry of Hemmingford, Que. One great grand-daughter Meghan Slachetka.

The funeral service was on March 10, 1991 at 2 p.m., conducted by Rev. Dr. J.J. Edminston, in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Hemmingford. The choir sang Malcolm's favorite hymn "Jesus Loves of My Soul." The pallbearers were Ivan Sellar, David Napper, Douglas Kyle, Robbie Kyle, Arthur Bachelder and Brian Bachelder.

By some he is remembered as the elderly man who told jokes, anecdotes and stories, with a terrific sense of humour.

However, over the years many had received his assistance, encouragement and help. Unfortunately, most of the recipients have pre-deceased him. He enjoyed young and old, felt life had been good to him, and set an example for others. As a friend wrote of Malcolm, "We are the better for having known him."
