

## The late Dorothy Thompson

The community was saddened to learn of the death of Dorothy Thompson at the Barrie Memorial Hospital on Saturday, July 16, 1991, in her 69th year.

Dorothy was born in Montreal on June 15, 1922 and was married to Les Thompson on October 18, 1975. She received her education at Lorne in Pointe-St-Charles and Strathern Commercial High School in Verdun. She lived in Lachine for 35 years.

They moved to Hemmingford in 1977 and

they became active members of the Hemmingford Bowling League where Dorothy was treasurer for eight years. She loved doing crafts and was a member of New York State Federation of Home Bureaus Inc. and the Hemmingford Craft group. She was also a member of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church.

She is survived by her husband, Les Thompson and a daughter Eileen (Duncan) Carroll; a daughter Sherleen predeceased her. She is also survived by an Uncle Wm.

Pinkington and Iris; two nephews Grant Pinkington, Bryan Pinkington, and one niece Janet (Stacey) Shanahan; two sisters-in-law, Muriel Thompson and Diana VanWalsum; one brother-in-law, Donald Thompson and wife Myrtle; four grandchildren, Leanne, Vincent, Kassy and Caprice Thompson; and two stepsons, David and Bryan (Gayle) Thompson.

## The late David Goodall

David passed away on June 15, 1991 after a lengthy battle with cancer at the age of 40. A memorial service was held on June 17, 1991 at Georgetown Presbyterian Church in Howick. The service was conducted by Rev. Larry Paul, assisted by Howard Sullivan. Archie Borland sang "Amazing Grace".

David, eldest son of Jean and Hugh Goodall of Allans Corner, and brother to Alan, Debbie Waller and Amy Tollhurst, grew up in the Ormstown area. He attended school in Ormstown and was in the first graduating class at CVR, having the honour as being valedictorian and receiving the Birks Gold Medal, the Reeves Scholar-

ship and a Scholarship to McGill University. David received his Bachelor of Civil Engineering from McGill University in 1973; his Master of Engineering Science in London at the University of Western Ontario in 1975; and his PhD Engineering in 1986 from the University of California in Berkeley.

After graduating from Western, David accepted a position with Golder Associates where he worked for 8 years. Among several projects in Western Canada he spent two years in the Yukon supervising the construction of a mining dam and canal for the Cypress Anvil Mine. A waterway in

the area of the mine was named in his honour, Goodall Creek.

In 1986, as a Research Scientist, David began employment with the Norwegian Company SINTEF. He furthered his post doctorate work "Containment of Gas in Rock Caverns" in Norway until his illness.

David's career and studies took him to a world away from the Chateaugay Valley. His modesty left many of his accomplishments unknown to his friends and family. All those who knew and loved David will always remember him best as described by Rev. Paul as "one with humility, intelligence and sensitivity".
